Let Your Light Shine Bright!

Have you ever stopped to think about the different roles you play in others' lives? Maybe you are a parent, child, sibling, or grandparent. At work, you have a relationship with supervisors and co-workers. Perhaps you teach a class or serve as a mentor to others at church. Do you participate in sports or volunteer with other organizations? Do you shop? Go to the doctor or dentist? I think you get the point!

By now you're thinking, "I know why I am so tired all of the time!" But, guess what? Our busy lives give us plenty of opportunities to let our lights shine! With each interaction, you have a chance to show that you are different from the world. You have an opening to build a relationship!

As we develop these bonds, it is critical to understand this influence works both ways. If we are respectful to others, we will build a positive relationship and allow Christian values to flourish. Treat someone poorly and our reputation is tarnished.

The writers of Proverbs understood the importance of these interactions when they collected the wisdom preserved for us today. Passages throughout the book provide insights guaranteed to improve our relations with others. There are discussions of marriage, the parent-child relationship, dealing with anger, identifying quality friends, and communication.

The passages on communication are particularly interesting because our words have a significant impact on others. Words build people up, but they can tear them

down as well. Proverbs addresses this with advice for our speech that I have broken down into two categories (along with a few examples) –

- 1) Sensible words should be cherished.
 - · Proverbs 15:1 A gentle answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger.
 - · Proverbs 16:23 The hearts of the wise make their mouths prudent, and their lips promote instruction.
- Sometimes, the best words are left unsaid.
 - · Proverbs 17:28 Even fools are thought wise if they keep silent, and discerning if they hold their tongues.
 - · Proverbs 10:18 Whoever conceals hatred with lying lips and spreads slander is a fool.

While our words are impactful, we really let our light shine when we have mastered the concept of listening. Think about it. If we really cherish someone and want to let them know they are important, then remove all the distractions and take some time to listen to them! Proverbs reinforces that idea.

- · Proverbs 1:5 Let the wise listen and add to their learning, and let the discerning get guidance.
- Proverbs 18:2 Fools find no pleasure in understanding but delight in airing their own opinions.

· Proverbs 18:13 - To answer before listening—that is folly and shame.

Three concepts stand out to me when reading those passages. If we listen for guidance, listen for understanding, and listen with patience then our love for those around us will be apparent.

I am going to conclude by offering up these challenges for the week ahead –

- Praise someone for the blessings they add to your life. How many people have influenced your life in a special way? Tell them they are appreciated! A kind word goes a long way.
- Check on someone that is struggling. It may be a friend dealing with health issues or someone facing difficulties at work or school. Show them that you care!
- Show your gratitude for the help others provide.
 Start with your family and expand out to the community. Tell your mail carrier or the sanitation workers that you are grateful for them (our lives would be much worse without them). Remember those who labor in the background.
- Finally, take a break from your day and listen to those around you. You might be surprised what you learn.
